Regional Foundations (6 credits) Students must complete two regional courses. The courses must represent 1st Year: different regions. Region 1: 2nd Year: Region 2: Concentration (15 credits) 3rd Year: Concentrations must be declared by the end of the sophomore year using the Concentration Declaration Form and must consist of courses from at least two different academic disciplines (e.g., HIST and PSC). Electives Concentration: Courses that do not satisfy specific requirements are considered electives. Course #1: Electives are taken in addition to the courses used to satisfy the requirements above to earn 120 credits. Course #2: **-120 credits** or more are required to graduate. Course #3: **-60 credits** must be earned in residence at GW. Course #4: -A **2.0 cumulative GPA** is required to graduate. -Except for approved WID courses, no double-counting is permitted.
