


Elliott School Majors

- Six STEM courses totaling 18 credits



## Options: Transferring vs. Second Major

**Transferring** into the Elliott School changes your home school within the University. New advising office, new General Curriculum Requirements Your Elliott School major is listed first on your diploma.

Adding International Affairs as a **second major** does not change your home school.

Same advising office (though you can utilize our office as a resource for your major requirements), same GCR's.

Your non-Elliott major is listed first on your transcript.

We also offer a Minor in International Affairs.

Prerequisites for Transferring into the Elliott School

1. Have at least <u>24 credits</u> earned at GW. 2. Have a cumulative GPA of <u>3.0</u> or above

3. Complete or waive the <u>first year</u> of a modern foreign <u>language</u>. (See the next slide for details.) 4. Complete at least four of the following <u>courses</u> (AP and transfer courses count):

PSC 1001; PSC 1003;
 ECON 1011; ECON 1012;
 HIST 1011


Demonstrate the first-year of foreign language to transfer to the Elliott School

Take coursework – successful completion of two semesters (e.g. SPAN 1011, or ARAB 1001 & 1002).

Take **placement exam** to determine level – if your level is above second semester, you meet the internal transfer requirement.

> Print results <u>and</u> bring to Elliott School advising office during Drop-In Advising hours for advisor signature

If you were required to take the **TOEFL or IELTS**exam as part of your admissions application to GW, then this requirement is fulfilled.

### After Submitting Your Internal Transfer Plan: Meet with an Elliott Advisor

- Schedule an Appointment
  - Online Appointment System: <u>https://elliott.gwu.edu/undergraduate-academic-advising</u>
  - Full 30-minute appointment recommended
  - Drop-In Advising (15 min) for quick questions:
    - Monday Friday, 10am-12pm and 2pm-4pm
- What will the advisor do during the appointment?
  - Discuss with you your reasoning and motivation to transfer
  - Review your Internal Transfer Plan and Curriculum
  - Walk through the "What If" feature

Applications for Internal Transfer are submitted to the Office of the Registrar (Marvin Center, Student Services Hub or emailed to <u>registrar@gwu.edu</u>)


If using a placement exam to demonstrate first-year foreign language proficiency, attach your placement exam results signed by an Elliott School academic advisor.

Complete Internal Transfer Request Form

By October 15 for Spring transfer By February 15 (if all requirements are complete) or May 31 for Fall transfer (if requirements are in progress)

Transfer requests will NOT be accepted prior to the second semester of enrollment at GW.

To follow up on applications, contact the Office of the Registrar



Stay on track to graduate

Continue to work with your current academic advisor Utilize Elliott School drop-in advising or email your Elliott School advisor if you have questions about the curriculum

Try to take courses that count for both majors in case you end up not transferring to Elliott
